- Started as outreach effort for the community hospitals with the lack of Infectious Diseases (ID) specialty to avoid delay in the patient care who otherwise would require the transfer.


PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT – What & Why


- Started from existing resources only
 - Telecart (Amwell C500), ID
 providers no new hires
- Administrative support in navigating system
- Stakeholders remote sites
 - Providers, Nursing, Pharmacy
- Establishing workflow IT, Finance
- Identifying patients (=diagnoses) that benefits the overall patient care
- Transition to outpatient care OPAT, hospital discharge follow up



Challenges:

- Shared resources with other tele-services
- Effective use of technology by the nursing team at remote site
- Communication timely notification of new consults, engaging with primary teams at remote sites
- ID providers with simultaneous other clinical commitments
- Transition to outpatient ID care
- Billing and coding
